Baltimore Gas & Electric (BGE) —Changing the Channel on Safety: BGE's Certified Safety Podcast

Who says safety has to be boring? BGE flipped the script with its Certified Safety Podcast, a series of bite-sized, five-minute episodes designed to cut through the noise and make safety messages stick. By featuring real conversations with leaders and experts, these episodes became more than reminders, they became **catalysts for action**.

The result? A culture shift. Employees aren't just hearing about safety, they're talking about it, applying it, and owning it. Baltimore Gas & Electric (BGE) —Crisis Response in Action: Key Bridge Collapse Recovery

When disaster struck with the collapse of the Francis Scott Key Bridge, BGE moved fast, executing a **mission-critical emergency response** to isolate and restore a 24" gas transmission line buried beneath the Patapsco River. This was no routine fix. It was a race against time, requiring 24/7 coordination across federal, state, and local agencies.

The outcome? **Zero service interruptions. 165,000 customers protected.** And vital progress toward reopening the Port of Baltimore. In the face of tragedy, BGE delivered precision, partnership, and poise, showing the entire industry what it means to be ready when it matters most.

This is emergency management at its finest: fast, collaborative, and community-first.

Some challenges aren't just technical, they're legendary. Williams tackled one of them head-on, completing a **3,400-foot horizontal directional drill** under the Coosa River, a project that had stalled others for years. This wasn't just an engineering win, it was a breakthrough.

By eliminating a major system bottleneck while minimizing environmental impact, the project **unlocked more reliable, cleaner power generation for the region**. It took vision, grit, and cross-functional teamwork to make it happen, and it sets a new bar for what's possible in infrastructure innovation.
